Solar co-op makes power cheaper

MORGANTOWN — Neighbors in north-central West Virginia have formed a solar co-op and are leveraging their bulk buying power to go solar together and get a discount.

The group is seeking more members and will be hosting an informational meeting at 6 p.m. July 27 at the Morgantown Public Library. The co-op is open to residents of Morgantown, Fairmont, Clarksburg and other communities within an hour's drive of Morgantown.

Those interested in joining the co-op can sign up at wvsun.org/solarcoops/north-central-wv. Joining the co-op is not a commitment to purchase panels. Once the group is large enough, WV SUN will help the co-op solicit competitive bids from area solar installers. Co-op members can save up to 20 percent off the cost of installation by going solar with the group.
